Eugene (Gene) Szymczak



Eugene (Gene) Szymczak was posthumously honored Sunday as recipient of the 2017 Kristin Visser Award for Historic Preservation for his rehabilitation of Frank Lloyd Wright's Thomas P. Hardy House in Racine. Szymczak, who died December 3, arguably saved the house for another 100 years when he bought it in September, 2012 and began four years of repairs.



The award is presented by directors of the Seth Peterson Cottage Conservancy at the diminutive (but stunning) Wright-designed cottage on Mirror Lake. It is presented every other year to an individual or organization in recognition of past work in historical preservation of a Wright or Prairie School building in Wisconsin or a contiguous state. Buildings constructed between 1900 and 1925 are given preference, and the restoration work shall have been substantially completed within the two calendar years previous to the year of application.

The award is named in honor of Kristin Visser, who was instrumental in the restoration of the Seth Peterson Cottage and a tireless worker in its behalf. She is the author of *Frank Lloyd Wright and the Prairie School in Wisconsin*, and, with John Eifler, A.I.A., *Frank Lloyd Wright's Seth Peterson Cottage: Rescuing a Lost Masterwork*. Bill Martinelli of the Conservancy presented the award to Tom, (left), Curt, Jim and Joan Szymczak. Tom and Jim are Gene's brothers and Curt is a nephew of his. Joan, who is married to Tom, tirelessly helped with the rehabilitation and staged the house for the many benefit tours which Gene generously opened the house for.

Recognition includes a large plaque, a monetary award, and a small plaque affixed to a marker near the cottage. The marker is mounted on a slab of sandstone shaped like the state of Wisconsin. Martinelli found the slab at a nearby quarry.

Tom Szymczak wrote to the Conservancy after the presentation, "Our sincere thank you for honoring Gene with the Visser award. On the surface Gene would not have liked the attention but I believe deep down inside he would have seen it as a 'thank you.' I know at times, especially early on in the project, he would wonder what he had gotten himself into. But once he saw the public begin to cherish the house, he knew it was all worth it. Gene had plans of retiring in the Hardy house and sharing it with visitors so they could feel the magic of a Wright-designed home. We truly lost a person that Lived by Example. Again, Thank You for honoring Gene with this award."

More than 200 people participated.

The Seth Peterson Cottage Conservancy collaborated with the Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation in a nationwide effort to recognize Wright's life and work. Reservations for the Cottage remain strong with bookings through 2018 and into 2019. People are planning far in advance; but plans can change. Occasionally there are cancellations so those with flexible schedules may be able to obtain a reservation on short notice. Our rental agent, Sand County Service Agency, maintains a list of people to call when a cancellation occurs.

And, of course, the people who rent the Cottage and visitors on Open House days generate the revenue needed to successfully maintain and operate the Cottage. HELP WANTED: NEWSLETTER DESIGN & LAYOUT



Christopher Lord, the 2017 winner of the Jill Vladick Memorial Scholarship Award, is described by his instructors and Taliesin residents as a Renaissance Man. Among other things, he has taught English in middle schools, including in the inner city in Los Angeles, where he found teaching rewarding due to fewer distractions for the students than in the suburbs.

His mother was an art history teacher and he visited Taliesin West at the age of seven. His grandfather suggested that one day he should go there as a student and three architecture classes in high school strengthened his interest. He compares the different climate and desert landscape at Taliesin West area to living on Mars, with glowing ceilings, weird life outside, and open horizons.

His education was quite varied before enrolling at Taliesin. In addition to his teaching degree, he has a Master's Degree in Urban Planning from UCLA, and also majored in theater because he has always felt free to study what he wants. He is in his fourth and final year at Taliesin. He had already finished all required credits, but stayed on longer because he enjoys the life there. He speaks of being intrigued with educational philosophy, and describes talking and living architecture, as "slowly marinating in the culture, and being changed by it." After he graduates in the spring, he may teach again or pursue a doctorate in education. □

THE SETH PETERSON COTTAGE

More than 200 people attended the Seth Peterson Cottage 25th Anniversary program on Sunday, June 4, 2017. The anniversary program celebrated the 25 years since the Cottage was opened to the public in June 1992 and the 150th birthday of Frank Lloyd Wright on June 8th.

The speakers for the day included Ben Bergey, John Eifler and Tim Wright. Bergey is the head of the Bureau of State Parks speaking about non-profit Friends groups, such as the Seth Peterson Cottage Conservancy, adding value to the state park system. Eifler was the rehabilitation architect responsible for the design and oversight of the demolition and reconstruction of the Cottage. Tim Wright, Frank Lloyd Wright's grandson, spoke on his early life spending summers at Taliesin. Wright and his wife were able to experience the Cottage by spending a night in the Cottage.

MIRROR LAKE STATE PARK REPORT

We are moving out of our “busy season” and into our “slightly less busy” seasons at Mirror Lake State Park. With such a beautiful location and our proximity to the Wisconsin Dells area, we see many visitors year round. We may not fill the campgrounds each night, but a lot of people still come out to enjoy the park and this beautiful area.

Fall sees us working on cleanup and improvements to campgrounds, getting trails ready for the ski season, maintaining equipment, and many other tasks in addition to continued service to visitors. We look forward to this time to get some of the jobs done that we cannot quite get to with all the summer visitors.

A great example of a project perfect for this time of year is replacement of fire rings. Thanks to funds raised by the Friends of Mirror Lake State Park and a grant from Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Fund we have been able to purchase 50 new fire rings for campsites. This spring we replaced 20, and this fall the other 30 will be replaced. This project’s improvement to the visitor experience is made possible by the work of volunteers and donors. Not only did the Friends pay for the rings, but several of their members put in a lot of time helping with the replacement work. We hope for another good work day to finish up the project this fall. We also hope to refurbish all 50 of the fire rings that we replaced in order to bring them back to the park and continue to improve more campsites. Those rings that are too far gone will be recycled.

The fire rings are just one of the great projects that go on at the park, the lake, and the surrounding area. As many of you reading this newsletter know, it takes many hours from many dedicated people to make a difference (like saving a beautiful piece of architecture). We certainly could not provide the great experience for park visitors with our staff efforts alone.

In the area of staff, we have a few changes that are worth sharing. Unfortunately, Becca Weber, our full-time Ranger, has left Mirror Lake to pursue a career with the Juneau County Sheriff’s Department. She will certainly be missed, but we wish her the best of luck in her new position. The Parks and Recreation Management program is actively recruiting rangers, and we may be welcoming a new ranger as you read this article (we hope). The Parks and Recreation Management program is also transitioning out of law enforcement work. Over the winter our staff will end law enforcement duties and the conservation warden program will start to do all law enforcement work for the DNR. While our staff will not be directly responsible for law enforcement, we will have a strong partnership with the wardens to keep public safety our top

priority. This will be a change, but the park will continue to be a safe and beautiful place to visit.

As always, we love to remind visitors that fall and winter provide some of the best experiences at the park. Visitors will be able to enjoy our beautiful fall colors, take on some exciting hikes, and get out on the lake this fall. This winter we will look forward to good snow conditions for our ski trails, and the lake is more popular than ever for ice fishing. We hope to see you at the park. ☐
